She is a mediatress to Christ for everyone, because she was deemed worthy to give birth to the Lord and to become the Mother of God. She carries Him in Her arms and continuously entreats Him.

Since we sinners do not have the boldness to run directly to God from the start, we cry out to His Mother. She regenerates us; she intercedes; she anticipates all our afflictions. She is our protectress and helper, more honourable than all the angels, beyond compare more glorious than the Cherubim and Seraphim, second in rank only to the Holy Trinity. Oh, but she is good, my good girl, so sweet, that you want to embrace her at every moment and obtain consoling grace. The more you love, the more you are loved.

THE MOST-BLESSED QUEEN

In actual fact, through the ages many were granted the divine condescension, glory and might, as David also says: "Thy friends, O God, have been greatly honoured by me; and their rule has been greatly strengthened. I will number them, and more than the sands shall they be multiplied"

(Ps. 138/139:17-18). "Many daughters," according to Solomon, "have obtained riches, and many have wrought valiantly" (Prov. 31: 29-30). And here is the All-Pure Virgin Mary, and She is most exceedingly exalted over all and for all. While she alone stood between God and the human race. God became the Son of Man, and made men sons of God. She made Heaven of earth and deified the human race. She alone of all women is shown to be a mother by nature and the Mother of God transcending every law of nature. Through ineffably giving birth, She has become the Queen of everything in both the earthly and heavenly creation. Through Herself, She exalted those subiect to Her, and while on earth showed obedience to heavenly rather than earthly things, and She shared in greater rewards and greater power. Through the ordination She received from Heaven through the Divine Spirit. She became the most exalted and most-blessed Queen of a blessed lineage.

THE GIFT OF CHILDREN AND PARENTHOOD IN THE BIBLE

Children are a blessing; they are the fruit of procreation in which men and women share in God's creation and reflect His creative power. The Lord Himself orders the world in such a way that mankind is to be fruitful and multiply in order to be stewards of His creation (Genesis 1:28). God is gracious and so we read in Genesis that when Sarah was barren and beyond child bearing years God gave her the joy

of a son. Her son's name Isaac meaning laughter reflected both her doubt of God's promise that she could bear a son in her old age and the joy and laughter that the child brought her when he was born. Nothing is impossible for God

The Psalmist recognises this bestowal of grace when he says in Psalm 127: "Children are a gift from the Lord; they are a real blessing."

Hannah also in Old Testament times (1 Kingdoms 1) prayed for a child and the Lord granted her request in the birth of Samuel who became the great prophet of Israel. As she prays before the Lord she prays from the heart such that her lips move but there is no sound. St Cyprian sees her prayer as a model of the Church. "pouring her heart out in prayer silently and modestly within the recesses of her heart and with manifest faith." Hannah foreshadows the Most Holy Theotokos in that she displays faith in God's answer before receiving it. She exclaimed: "The Lord has filled my heart with joy; how happy I am because of what he has done!"

Of course parents have a duty of care to protect their children and to bring them up in accordance with God's law. In the book of Proverbs we read the wise saying: "Teach a child to choose the right path, and when he is older he will remain upon it".

Nevertheless, Our Lord saw in children a loving simplicity and a natural appreciation of mystery and holiness: "Let the children come to me and do not stop them because the kingdom of God belongs to such as these...". He goes further and uses them as a model of discipleship... "I assure you that whoever does not receive the Kingdom of God like a child will never enter it."

This is the pattern for all people, that as children are dependent upon their parents so we should be dependent upon and obedient to Our Father in heaven.
